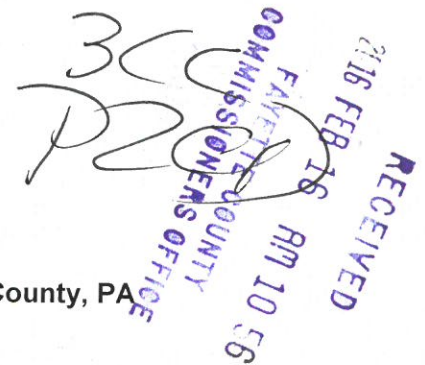

Dear Ms. Revak:

On behalf of Texas Eastern Transmission (Texas Eastern), L.P., a Spectra Energy Partners subsidiary, Natural Resource Group (NRG), LLC, an ERM company, has prepared this notice to inform you of Texas Eastern's intent to submit an application to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) for the following project:

1. Project Name: New Salem Utility Line Maintenance Project
2. Project Description: Utility Line maintenance within an existing right-of-way including earthwork, stone, and fill in three affected areas.
3. Applicant Name: Texas Eastern Transmission, L.P.

Section 1905-A of the Commonwealth Administrative Code, as amended by Act 14, requires that each applicant for a DEP permit must give written notice to the municipality and the county in which the permitted activity is located. The written notices shall be received by the municipality and county at least 30 days before the Department may issue or deny the permit.

Acts 67 and 68, which amended the Municipalities Planning Code to support sound land use practices and planning efforts, direct state agencies to consider comprehensive plans and zoning ordinances when reviewing applications for permitting of facilities or infrastructure, and specify that state agencies may rely upon comprehensive plans and zoning ordinances under certain conditions as described in Sections 619.2 and 1105 of the Municipalities Planning Code.

Enclosed is a Location Map for this project prepared by NRG on behalf of the applicant for this project. DEP invites you to review the attached enclosures and comment on the land use aspects of this project; please be specific to DEP when identifying any areas of conflict. If you wish to submit comments for DEP to consider in a land use review of this project, you must respond within 30 days to the DEP regional office listed below:

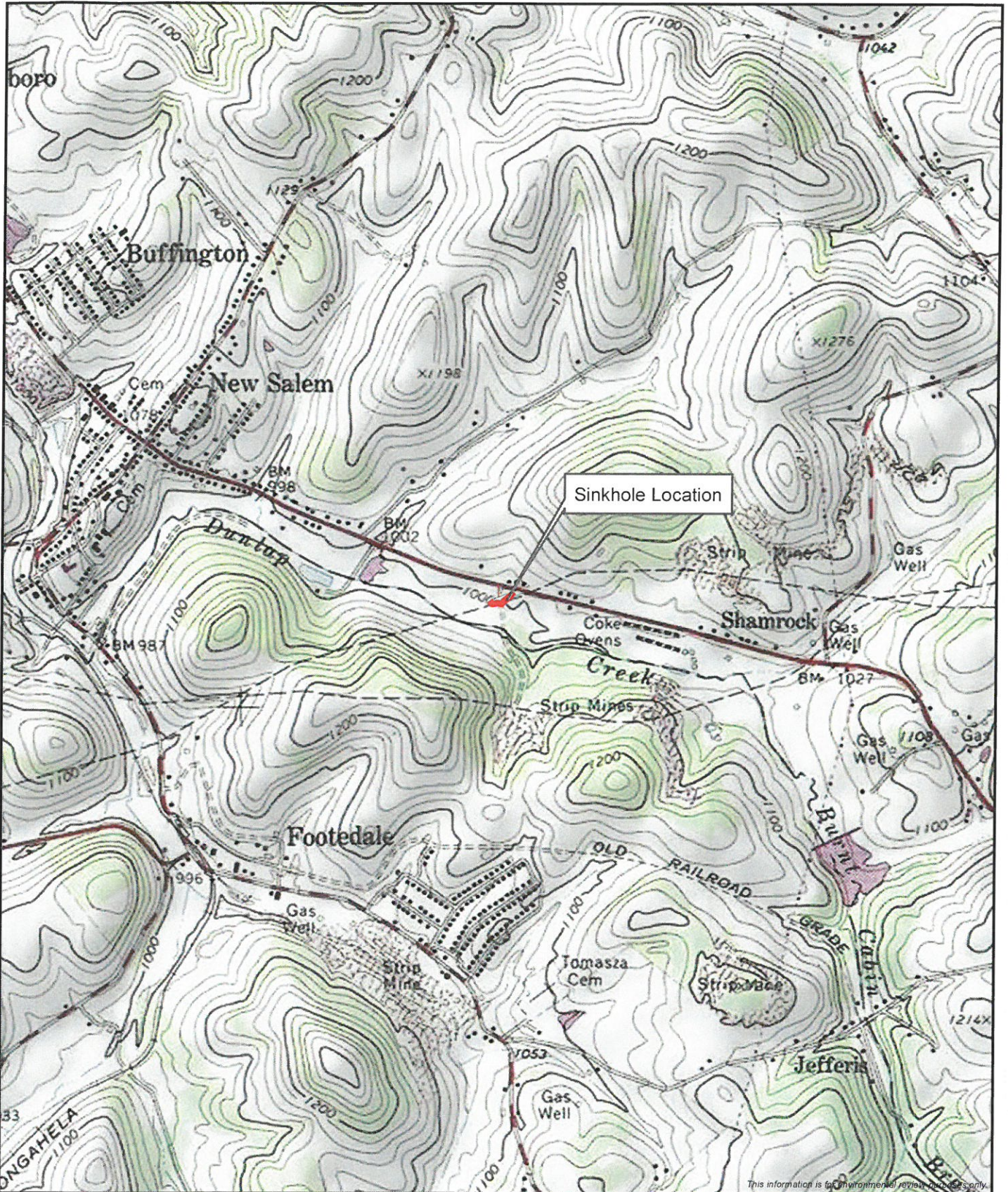

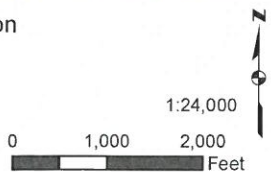
